OUR CHURCHES CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

We have several families at Christ's Chapel that have foster children in their homes. In some instances, this journey leads to adoption. In every instance, I am inspired and impressed with the level of commitment required to create 'family' for kids who otherwise would have limited access to compassionate care and the benefits of a faith community. The numbers are staggering. Over 400,000 U.S. children are in foster care.

Our local churches can make a real difference in the lives of some of the most vulnerable members of our society. The mandate of scripture is clear. God's heart is for the fatherless and orphaned, those who are marginalized in our culture.

We recently took a full weekend of services to have one of our foster care families tell their story. We additionally recognized all the parents that have either adopted or foster care children as part of their family. The following Monday, we invited a local foster care agency to come and answer questions from those in our congregation considering their own options. Our goal was primarily to educate and hopefully inspire interest, but also to build support for those already on this journey.



There are four additional ways your local church can have a positive impact on the foster care system...

- 1. Pray: Gather members from your church and pray for children and families already involved in the foster care system. Ask God to give your church family specific ways to get more involved on a hands-on level.
- 2. Educate: Similar to most cultural issues, the American church often lacks awareness and education of the facts that will enable believers to make a focused and informed plan of action.
- 3. Implement a Plan: Take the next step and put into place specific actions to move the conversation forward. Celebrate victories, birthdays, and special moments in your service to keep awareness alive and give attention to the children and families already on this journey.
- 4. Stay Engaged: Encourage members of your local church to consider being foster or adoptive parents. Look for opportunities to come alongside those in your church that are already doing so, offering them a few days off by providing care for their children.

MOSES WAS A FOSTER KID

Our hearts are often moved when we think of adoption and foster care. However, our hearts being moved does not always result in action. It is easy to hear of a need, but assume someone else will be the solution. Indeed, I recognize not everyone is equipped to foster or adopt a child. Much like the mandate of missions, we are all called to do something. You may not be called to go, but you are called to support those who are going.

Children in orphanages or foster care are all kids of trauma. As such, stepping into their world of hurt is a calling. It is not for the faint of heart. It is God's heart. Jesus was adopted by His earthly father, Joseph. Moses was a foster kid. He was placed in a basket in the Nile River because his life was in danger if he remained with his birth parents. In God's providence, Moses ended up in the home of Pharoah's daughter—a foster son who grew up in the presence of royalty.

God had a divine plan for Moses' life as he does for the 400,000+ kids in foster care across America. Over the past twelve years, Jenna and I have sought to be a voice for these kids. We are always honored when a pastor or member of one of our churches reaches out to us for information, guidance, and prayer. The time has come for KMN to have a full-time person devoted to the foster care crisis in KY. Pastor Joe covered stats from our state; I will not present those again. Suffice it to say that the need is great and is growing.

We are thankful for the overturning of Roe V. Wade in America. That decision increases the need and opportunity for Christ's church to actively participate in foster care. Every one

of our churches can be involved at some level. We can all work to be a part of the solution. I will again represent KMN in December at the AG Foster Network Conf in Dallas, TX. If you are interested in joining Jenna and me, I encourage you to make plans now.

Over the years, churches across America have contacted their local foster care offices to offer their assistance. In many cases, with great success. At other times, the foster care workers find themselves with another promise yet unfulfilled. How do we help our local churches and the foster care system? The answer is through the recruitment of a Foster Care Chaplain in KY. This position, appointed by AGUSM, is focused on the full-time and ongoing support of our KY foster care system and connecting us, the local body, to the foster needs in our local community.

- Will you consider joining Jenna and me in Dallas this December?
- Will you join me in asking God to raise a foster care chaplain here in KMN?
- Will you pledge to support our foster care chaplain monthly once he/she is in place?
- Will you prayerfully consider whether God is calling you to foster care chaplaincy?

Every child in every community deserves a chance at a better life and an introduction to Jesus Christ. Who knows, God may bring another Moses into your care.

"A father to the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in his holy dwelling. God sets the lonely in families, he leads out the prisoners with singing; but the rebellious live in a sun-scorched land" (Psalm 86:5-6).

Maybe you grew up without a father; far too many do. Everyone battles loneliness at one time or another, in one way or another. But God is not passive in those moments or seasons. He defends. He sets. He leads out.

My U40 friend, you know this. You preach this to lonely, grieving, disconnected people you serve in ministry. God uses us as spiritual mothers and fathers to baby believers, developing disciples, and sometimes even to seasoned saints. (Don't sleep on my alliteration skills.)

But this promise is for us. *It is for you*. Are you looking for a coach as you navigate life in ministry? God is a father to the fatherless, and He sets the lonely in families. Are you bothered by your singleness or by the fact that you are single again? God is a defender

of widows—of everyone grieving lost love. You may feel trapped...isolated...cut off. But God leads prisoners out with singing. Only the chronically rebellious die in the desert.

Let me make a practical suggestion: Go to your sectional council in October. Strike up a conversation with the executive leadership team member facilitating your meeting (Pastor Joe, Pastor Terry, Pastor Darren, or Pastor Dick). Look for a fellow U40 minister, and schedule coffee or lunch. Watch the ministers who are older than you—introduce yourself to the one making real connections with other people in the room.

God sets the lonely in families—the Kentucky Ministry Network is a family. We are better together, and the best is yet to come!



KMN is working hard to provide U40 ministers with opportunities for spiritual growth and leadership development. Our new **Coaching Calls** will interview a special guest who can offer insight and inspiration to us as young ministry leaders and calls will close with Q&A time. Hey Church Leaders! We see you and you are doing fantastic but difficult work. It can be paralyzing to begin asking those big questions. It can be intimidating to think about working with government and agencies. "Where do I start?" "Who do I call?" "What do I ask?"

All of the endless questions can feel like a burden and a hard task adding to that weight you feel as a pastor. Don't sweat it, though. That's where Backyard Orphans come in!

If the church remains silent and inactive, kids in care will remain in need of families. In fact, there are counties that have foster children spending nights in shelters and child welfare offices because there are not enough foster homes to place these children in.

If the church remains silent and inactive, current foster families within churches and communities remain in need of support. Lack of support leads to higher burnout rates, and higher burnout rates lead to more children moving from home to home without the stability they need.

If we, the Church, remain silent and inactive, we will miss a God-given opportunity to share the love of Jesus. The Church has a responsibility to care for orphans. We must respond in obedience to the mandate spelled out in Scripture.










"I knew I didn't want to become a murderer..."

Jose* (name changed) grew up in a single-parent home in Mexico. At 9 years old he ran away from his dysfunctional home and went to the streets. His mother never looked for him, though she knew where he was. For three days he had nothing to eat. "I prayed to God, but he didn't answer..." he remembers. In desperate need, he knew where to get a job: with the neighborhood drug dealer. For the next few years he survived by selling drugs, and ended up dating his employer's daughter and having a baby with her.

When his boss asked Jose to go kill a man, his world changed. "I knew I didn't want to become a murderer..." he said. So he spared the man's life. However, the man whose life he was supposed to take came looking to murder him. Finding only Jose's girlfriend, he killed her instead. Her enraged father was ready to kill Jose, but gave him a chance to run away only because he was the father of his grandchild. So at the age of 16, the father of a child, and sought for revenge, Jose fled from people who wanted to have him killed and came to the United States to start a new life.


By the time we met Jose, he had contemplated suicide three times. But God was working on his behalf! He ended up coming to one of our local hispanic churches, where they were able to help him find a job, a family to stay with, and help

him get to school! He is in the process of learning that there is a God who loves him!

After speaking with a representative of the school district, we learned that like Jose, many minors come to the United States under extreme circumstances—undocumented, homeless, no relatives, and limited opportunities to make it. Through Jose, we became aware of the need for ministries to care for kids like him, and show them the love of God. They need to be protected, equipped to make it in life, and introduced to the love of a father that never fails or neglects them—God!

Would you pray with us as we continue to learn about this vulnerable group

and develop a ministry to serve them? We thank you for your prayers and support!

RADIO LATIDO WILL GO ON FM RADIO



Three and a half years ago we started Radio Latido, an online radio station broadcasting Spanish music and sermons 24/7. One year later, we applied with the FCC for an FM radio frequency. Our application was approved and 2 years ago we were granted a construction permit for a local radio station.

We started remodeling what used to be a dairy farm's milking house into what is going to be our station's studio. In the coming months, we will officially launch Radio Latido 88.1 FM, which will be the first Christian Spanish-speaking radio station to reach LaRue County and the surrounding areas.

We still need your prayers and financial support

Together we can bring God's spoken word in Spanish to your community. For the first time in over 15 years the FCC is allowing churches to get a free FM radio frequency in their area. Your church can now partner with us by applying for a low frequency Educational Radio, and, if approved, we will take care of the operations and programming.




REASONS TO CONTACT THE NETWORK OFFICE


